SELECTING THE PERFECT SURFBOARD

Whatever you are a beginner, intermediate or expert surfer, choosing the right board for your abilities and the conditions is crucial to having a successful, fun surfing experience.

The intermediate to expert surfer is generally going to have a pretty good idea about what they need to take out in any given wave type or conditions. The novice surfer, however, probably doesn't have this knowledge yet and may not realize what they need.

There is no surfboard that is perfect for one person on all types of waves or conditions. If you are going to be surfing on a regular basis, it's a good idea to build yourself a quiver of different boards of all shapes and sizes.

If you're starting out, you're probably only going to need one good beginner surfboard. However, in no time, you're going to advance enough to refine your surfboard choice to ensure you avoid surfing the wrong board.

There are several factors you must consider when choosing the right surfboard for any given day.


First and foremost, your skill level as a surfer. Are you a beginner, an intermediate or an expert surfer? There's no point surfing a high performance shortboard if you can't stand up.

Next would be your fitness level. Even at advanced levels of surfing, if you are not particularly fit, you may need to consider a board with a little more volume to maximize your wave count and session length.

Your size – your height and weight – which will help determine how much volume you would need for a style of board.

And finally, the type of waves you will be surfing. Are they going to be fast and hollow or soft, slow and crumbly? Different waves are going to need different boards.

All these factors are going to play a role in your surfing performance. While you may already consider each of these things at one time or another make sure you revisit these ideas when selecting your next surfboard for your dream quiver.









The nonstanding versions of surfing were more popular during the sport's dark decades in the 19th century, when Western-borne disease, religion and politics decimated the number of surfers in Hawaii and other Pacific island groups. (All three surfers in "Sandwich Islanders Playing in the Surf," a 1841 drawing, are riding

on their knees.) Stand-up riding then became synonymous with surfing during the sport's early 20th-century renaissance; while kneeboarding was undoubtedly a part of the surf scene, it was all but unmentioned as a surfing subcategory until the late '50s, and didn't gain any real popularity until the mid-'60s.



Kneeboarders often say they chose their version of the sport over stand-up surfing because of the increased sensation of speed that comes from riding closer to the water surface. In decades past, kneeboards were more maneuverable by far than regular boards, were easier to fit into tight sections on the wave.
